

<b>BASIC INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS</b>	
<b>GENERAL SUBJECTS</b>	Manuscripts must be COMPLETE, PERFECT and CLEAR (See the <a href="#">EASE</a> Guides published in many relevant languages). You can review the appropriate <a href="#">reporting guidelines</a> , if available.
<b>WORD LIMITS etc.</b>	
<b>Main Text</b> (Except references and abstract)	(justified exceptions allowed)
Clinical Research	≤ 3000
Compilation	≤ 3000
Letter to the Editor	≤ 750
Case Report	≤ 1500
<b>Abstract</b>	(It should consist of Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Conclusion sections)
Clinical Research	200 – 300 words
Compilation	200 – 300 words (Undivided)
Letter to the Editor	Without summary
Case Report	150 – 250 words (Undivided)
<b>Keywords</b>	≥ 3 words ≥ 6, separated by commas; lower case except proper nouns; avoid abbreviations (must be selected from <a href="#">Medical Subject Headings</a> )
<b>Tables/Figures</b>	≤ 5 table and ≤ 5 figure, A brief description of the scope of the table should be written above the table as a title. Explanatory texts and explanations of the abbreviations used should be below the table. Tables should be in the text of the article, one table per page, and tables should not be sent in JPEG, TIFF or other visual formats. Pictures must be uploaded to the system separately in JPEG or TIFF format. Descriptions of figures, pictures and graphics should be specified on the last page of the article main file. It should be consistent and informative, and all abbreviations should be explained. The place in the text should be specified.
<b>TITLE PAGE INFORMATION</b>	
Title	≤ X 100 characters
Short title	≤ X 40 character
Author names	The full names and titles of all authors, if they have been presented in a scientific meeting before, the official name, place and date of the meeting should be stated.
Institution information required	Name and city of institution, unit or division, e-mail
Contact information of the corresponding author	The name should be underlined and specified separately, and the full address, telephone, mobile phone and e-mail information should be added.
Persistent identifiers of the author(s), etc.	<a href="#">ORCID</a> information
<b>STRUCTURE OF THE MAIN TEXT, CONCLUSION, REFERENCES</b>	
Typical Headings	Main Topics: Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion, References
Subheadings	unnumbered

Special phrases required for any section	Methods section should include ethics committee approval (declaration of compliance with Helsinki declaration, institution, date and decision number information) for human and animal studies, "Statistical analysis" subsection that defines the variables and methods used in the study.
Final part (e.g. author contributions)	Identify authors by initials in the authors' contributions section (consider using <a href="#">CRediT</a> ) (Subtitle above References: Acknowledgments, Ethical Consent, Conflict of Interest, Financial Disclosure, if any)
References: maximum number	
Clinical Research	≤ 30
Compilation	≤ 60
Letter to the Editor	≤ 5
Case Report	≤ 15
Clinical Research	<a href="#">Vancouver</a> style should be used (In addition, if the number of authors is more than 6, "et al." should be used) Make sure that each citation is complete and correct.

#### **JOURNAL POLICIES, etc.**

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Referee evaluation	External, double-blind evaluation by at least 2 referees. Editors make the final decision.
Article acceptance rate and average times	About 30% of submitted articles are accepted. Average time from submission to first decision after peer review: 45 days
